AKC welcomes two new breeds: the Mudi and the Russian Toy

Two breeds with two very different histories and personalities gained full AKC recognition on January 1.



The Mudi is a medium-sized herding dog with a wash-and-wear coat. Like other herding breeds, the Mudi is smart, dependable, and driven — and needs to be kept occupied to prevent bad habits such as nuisance barking.



The Russian Toy is a petite dog with a big personality. The breed has two coat varieties — long-haired and short-haired — and requires minimal grooming. RTs are intelligent, humorous, and full of energy.
