Dear AKC Club Presidents, Secretaries, and Delegates,

We are writing to inform you of an upcoming change to the event service fee, which will take effect on **October 1, 2025**. The current fee of **\$3.00 per entry** will increase to **\$4.50 per entry**, while the **\$0.50 recoding fee** will remain unchanged.

This adjustment, the first since 2008, reflects the increasing cost of living (COLA). According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' CPI Inflation Calculator, the value of \$3.00 in place for 16 years is equivalent to **\$4.47** as of June 2024. We made a similar adjustment in 2023 to the Delegate expense reimbursements, which increased from \$200 to \$400.

While we have worked diligently to maintain the current fee structure, consistently rising costs have made it increasingly difficult to do so. The revenue generated from this fee is essential to supporting over **29,000** events held annually and funding important AKC initiatives that allow us to continue serving dogs and the dog community and advancing our mission.

We trust this advance notice provides you with ample time to plan accordingly.



It gives you off leash cooperation. Your dog associates you with something fun and is eager to be with you and listen to your call when loose.

It increases your own poise, ability to focus under stress, and selfcontrol.

It builds confidence.

Dear Customer:

Congratulations on acquiring your Shetland Sheep Dog. Please find the instructions for your particular model listed below:

Although your Sheltie comes fully assembled, due to particular issues during production, we do occasionally have issues with components such as screws. They invariably are either loose or missing altogether.

Mode 1: Sleep mode. Activated for the majority of the day as the Sheltie ages. This is normal and you should not worry about it, just accept the peace and quiet while you can.

Mode 2: Anarchy. Although we have tried to ease the effect of anarchy mode, it's not always possible. There are inherent issues with the timer settings of anarchy mode in regards to there being none. Should your Sheltie suddenly go from comatose to running around the walls, we cannot stop this feature.

Sunlight: Do not allow your Sheltie to stay in the sun too long. They can burn if left unattended but they also recharge. Too much of a charge and mode 2 can be activated without warning.

Energy consumption: This has been an ongoing issue as their energy consumption is too direct. We have tried to put baffles, non return valves and diversions in place but none to

seem to work adequately. Safe to say what goes in comes out, in both solids and gas. The gas, although noxious, can inhibit breathing of the owner for up to ten minutes. No need to worry about the solids - they will inevitably be found just underfoot.

Software: Your Sheltie is pre-installed with the highest software and hardware. This includes the loyalty chip, the love every one chip, fun chip and, of course, the highly popular mayhem chip. They are all running on the What-the-hell operating system 12.2. Although this has been in circulation for many years, we have found it simply cannot be improved upon.
